SHERRI MESSERSMITH earned a BS in the Teaching of Mathematics and an MS in Applied Math at the University from inner-city Chicago and East St. Louis. Sherri has over 25 years of experience teaching developmental math through the Chicago. She has served as the Chair of the Developmental Math at-risk students from inner-city Chicago and East St. Louis. Sherri in their latest Math with P.O.W.E.R. Learning series.

DR. TERRY BULLOCK was the first person in his family to achieve not only a college degree but a doctorate in education. A quick summation of his professional and academic achievements show the following: six books, approximately fifty journal publications, a like number of conference presentations, and thirty two years in the field of education. He states that his biggest accomplishments are co-founding TASS and developing the paired reading curriculum. His twenty years of research showed that students in paired reading courses did better than their non-paired peers in terms of their content course grade as well as their overall GPA. His book "Tools for Learning" (1990) was so successful in its debut in the United States that it was eventually reprinted in Spanish.

In addition to his teaching duties, Professor Bullock coordinated the Developmental Reading Program and then served as Associate Dean of the University College at the University of Cincinnati. Dr. Bullock was President of the American Reading Forum and Chair of the College Literacy and Learning Special Interest Group of the International Literacy Association. He retired as Professor Emeritus in Reading and Critical Thinking in the College of Education and the College of Applied Science at the University of Cincinnati.

Please use adult learning techniques and plan on active audience interaction in your program.

The abstract should be 200-300 words and include a clear purpose, methods or techniques, educational or scientific importance, learning objectives and intended outcomes, relevance to TASS audience, delivery style, session structure including audience interaction, results/conclusions and data sources.

Abstracts will be evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- Targets students' under-preparedness and success in various areas
- Contains innovative ideas and makes a significant contribution to the field
- Presents a practical skill/method/approach based explicitly on sound theory and research
- Provides evidence that practice has been assessed and proven effective
- Provides an accurate depiction of what to expect from the session
- Involves audience engagement and allows time for discussion, hands-on application, and Q&A
- Uses clear language to present goals of the session

Paper presentations are limited to 45 minutes. Panel presentations are 90 minutes long and should include three or more presenters focusing on one topic. Focus group sessions are 90 minutes long. Currently accepted proposals are posted on the website: www.tassconference.org.
