Generally, there are 50 to 70 sessions, where presenters using a workshop approach describe methods they have used to help students succeed in various academic areas such as reading, critical thinking, study skills, writing, ESL, math and science, social sciences and humanities. Other foci of interest include technology and online education, leadership and diversity, freshmen success and other transitional experiences, multiculturalism on college campuses, adult learners, students with disabilities, student support services, academic advising, career planning, program administration, graduate student perspectives, as well as preparing high school students for college. Each participant can come away with a wealth of practical ideas, strategies, and materials to take back to their respective institutions. The session formats range from 15-min flash presentations to 45-min paper presentations, to 90-min panels and

focus groups, to 3-hour Wednesday Workshops.

DAVID HARTLEB has served as a Leadership Coach for Achieving the Dream, Inc. He has worked with eighteen colleges in thirteen different states over more than six years. He also works as the Leadership Coach Advisor and Liaison for ATD. Achieving the Dream is a national non-profit organization with a network of over 220 colleges. The mission of ATD is "to achieve sustainable institutional transformation through sharing knowledge, innovative solutions and effective practices and policies leading to improved outcomes for all students." The focus of Leadership Coaching is to improve the completion rate for students, especially students of color and low income.

Following his retirement as a college president,

David Hartleb served as President of Northern Essex Community College in Massachusetts for over fifteen years. He focused on increasing access to low income and minority students, in part by having the Lawrence Campus designated as an Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI). Under his leadership the college won designation as an Achieving the Dream college in 2007 and in 2011 was awarded Leader College status. Also, he was a champion of Appreciative Inquiry which is a positive, strengthsbased process used in management and planning which helped transform the culture at the college.

Prior to moving to Northern Essex Community College, Hartleb worked for twenty-seven years at the University of Cincinnati as a professor, Dean and Vice President.

Please use adult learning techniques and plan on active audience interaction in your program.

The abstract should be 200-300 words and include a clear purpose, methods or techniques, educational or scientific importance, learning objectives and intended outcomes, relevance to TASS audience, delivery style, session structure including audience interaction, results/conclusions and data sources.

Abstracts will be evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- Targets students' under-preparedness and success in various areas
- Contains innovative ideas and makes a significant contribution to the field
- Presents a practical skill/method/approach based explicitly on sound theory and research
- Provides evidence that practice has been assessed and proven effective
- Provides an accurate depiction of what to expect from the session
- Involves audience engagement and allows time for discussion, hands-on application, and Q&A

Flash presentations are 15 minutes each; two subsequent flash presentations will be paired thematically and scheduled in the same room, followed by 15 minutes of the audience discussion involving all the presenters in that session.
